About the Freemasons

Freemasonry is not a secret society. It is a social organization based on a system of morality, veiled in allegory, and illustrated with symbols. The fraternity fosters introspection, self-improvement, and friendship. Morality, brotherly love, and philanthropy to the community at large are primary objects of all Freemasons. Each lodge participates in service towards the Grand Lodge of South Dakota sponsored charities, namely, the Masonic Model Student Assistance Training Program; the SD Masonic Child Identification Program (CHIP); the Masonic Scholarship Program; and the South Dakota Masonic Foundation, Inc.

Freemasons do not actively recruit for new members; to become one, ask one. To be eligible for membership you must be a man of 18 years of age or more; have a belief in a Supreme Being (No particular faith is required or excluded, all are welcome); be able to afford the initiation and annual dues without causing hardship to yourself or your family; and be willing to enter Freemasonry of your own free will and accord.
