## DISTRICT MASTER'S REPORT

This is my first article as the District Master of District 13. This is an Honor for me to serve our District.

This article was started after returning from Grand Lodge at Mitchell. It was a packed schedule and the re-dedication was fantastic. The Masonic family got a terrific shot in the arm by participating in the event. As you are probably aware, Right Worshipful Brother Richard Decker was elected as the Grand Junior Warden of the Grand Lodge Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of South Dakota. Your District is well represented in the Grand Lodge. There is a bit of disappointing news. Within the Grand Jurisdiction of South Dakota, there are 93 Lodges that make up the Grand Lodge. There were only 52 Lodges in attendance. With 93 Lodges, that means there are 93 Masters. Only 17 were present. Of 93 Senior Wardens only 8 and of 93 Junior Wardens there were only 5. There were 22 Lodge Secretaries. The unusual number was there were 69 proxies. As I have mentioned before, this is your Grand Lodge and yet it seems there is apathy in the ranks. WHY? The constitutional changes (1) to change the date of Grand Lodge to the 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend in January was soundly defeated. Thus, Grand Lodge will be the 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend in June for 2009.

I anticipate that District 13 will be strongly represented. I direct the new masters and officers to a portion of the installation ceremony: Do you promise to pay homage to the Grand Master for the time being and to his officers, when duly installed and strictly conform to every edict of the Grand Lodge, or general assembly of mason, that is not subversive of the principles and ground-work of masonry? Do you promise a regular attendance of the committees and communications of the Grand Lodge on receiving proper notice and to pay attention to all the duties of masonry on convenient occasions? To each of these questions the Master nods in acceptance. Please plan now to be in attendance in Sioux Falls.

The District meeting of the Lodge Officers was held in Gettysburg on July 20<sup>th</sup>. Of the seven Lodges in the District, only three were present. Onida, Fort Pierre and Pierre. Pre August 23<sup>rd</sup> information was presented. This information was mailed on July 24<sup>th</sup> to those who were not in attendance.

Lodges will be in readiness to begin a New Lodge Year. District Master visitations have been set for Onida (October 1<sup>st</sup>), Gettysburg (October 2<sup>nd</sup>), Blunt (October 6<sup>th</sup>), Pierre (October 13<sup>th</sup>), and Fort Pierre (October 20<sup>th</sup>).

The District meeting is set for September 28<sup>th</sup> at 2:00PM at Gettysburg. This will be an open meeting and Right Worshipful Grand Senior Warden Dean Behrens has been invited. It is requested that the Lodges of the District provide the following for lunch after the meeting.

Blunt, Harrold, Mobridge and Onida 2 dozen sandwiches.

Fort Pierre and Pierre salads and relish trays.

Gettysburg, 4 cakes and drink.

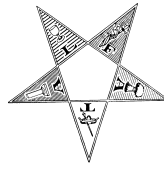

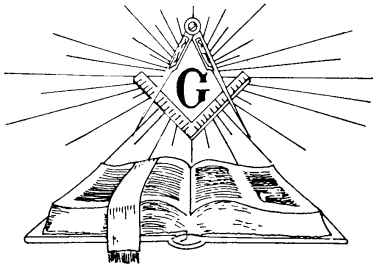

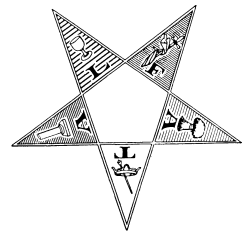
